Child care is the backbone of Missouri's economy, ensuring families can work and businesses are productive. Child Care Aware® of Missouri serves more than 17,000 families and 3,900 child care programs (employing over 35,000 Missouri taxpayers) per year.

> Research shows that high-quality birth-to-five programs for children can deliver a 13% per year return on investment. Significant gains are realized through better outcomes in education, health, social behaviors, and employment.

The overwhelming evidence shows that children who enter kindergarten behind are likely to remain behind throughout their educational careers and beyond. These gaps in achievement are difficult and expensive to close with

K-12 education alone.

We help ensure children enter kindergarten ready to learn by providing our youngest learners with options to access high-quality early childhood programs from ages zero to five, where they can develop the full range of skills necessary to be successful in school and life.

We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that delivers services focusing on the improvement of a child's experiences and environment in their first two-thousand days. Our work targets four main groups throughout Missouri: 1) families, 2) child care professionals, 3) businesses, and 4) community stakeholders.

CHILD CARE THAT WORKS FOR FAMILIES

With a focus on parental choice, we connect families to child care through our referral services. This ensures families can find care where needed, when needed. Through community outreach and a robust website, we provide families the information needed to be savvy, child care consumers.

IMPACTING CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

We work with child care programs to enhance their professional development and provide additional knowledge to help improve interaction with children. We aim to educate on a set of business standards to assist child care programs to increase the quality and sustainability of their business practices.

CHILD CARE SOLUTIONS FOR THE WORKFORCE

As a leading partner of Missouri's Child Care Professional Development System, we administer a statewide training calendar, provide training to Missouri's child care workforce, manage the T.E.A.C.H. MISSOURI Scholarship Program and the CDA Scholarship Project, and implement health and wellness practices to increase physical activity and access to better nutrition within early childhood settings. We are engaged in local, state, and national efforts to continuously improve the professional development system.
